Philosophy

The **Computer Assisted Instruction/ Community Based Program** is designed to keep students who are temporarily out of school connected to the educational process. It is our belief that students who continue to pursue their educational goals will be more successful when they return to a traditional academic program. The **CAI/CB Program** provides an option for students to stay in school, rather than drop-out and/or be unproductive.



Enrollment Process

Students who are eligible for the CAI/CB Program include the following:

1. Students expelled from the district (Must be recommended by a Hearing Officer)

Students must complete all of the following steps to enroll in the CAI/CB Program:

1. Arrange and attend a Diagnostic Center interview with the CAI Coordinator (A parent or guardian must attend)
2. Choose a program from the menu of credit options (With input from parents and CAI/CB Staff)
3. Sign the appropriate paperwork: application form, contract, & behavior policy .
4. Pay necessary fees (Fees must be paid or credit will be withheld)

Menu of Options

The CAI/CB Program is a four part program that offers credit for both Computer Assisted Instruction and Community Based Options. The **Menu of Options** below provides students an individualized way to earn up to **one** full credit.

Computer Assisted Instruction

Students are given an academic assessment on the computer and a program is individualized to their skill level. (Credit is earned by completing 45 hours for 1/4 credit and 90 hours for 1/2 credit)

Classes

Support group/ classes are designed to help students become more successful in their academics by focusing on the affective issues in their personal lives. (Credit is earned by completing 20 hours for 1/4 credit)

Community Based Component

The community based component allows students to be active in the community through working, service learning or physical activity. (Credit is earned by completing 90 hours for 1/4 credit)

Grading Criteria

Grades for the Computer Assisted Instructional Program are determined by completion of hours, computer/classroom work, behavior points and daily participation points. Grades for the Community Based Component are determined by the completion of all hours and paperwork by the end of the quarter. Grades for group classes and tutoring are determined by completion of hours and participation during class. A final report card will be issued on a quarterly basis stating grades and credit earned for each option.

Guidelines For Student Behavior

The CAI/CB Program provides students with the opportunity to stay attached to school and earn credit. Enrollment in the CAI/CB Program is limited. Students who are not successful will be warned, given support to change inappropriate behaviors, and expected to comply with published policies. Failure to respond to policies in an appropriate and timely manner will result in removal from the program.

Successful students may increase credits, improve academic/personal skills, return early from expulsion and return to a more comprehensive school environment.

Behavior Policies

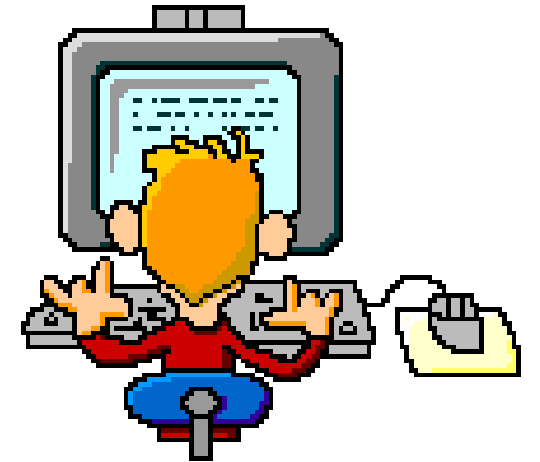
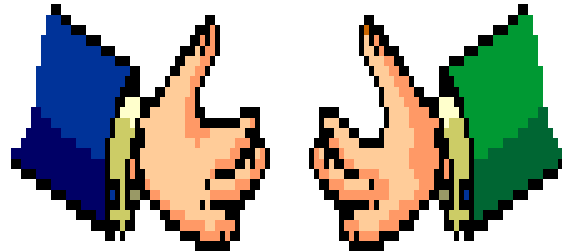
General behavior expectations include:
