DSIT - District School Improvement Team

Background – The District's Policy Council is a long-standing advisory body made up of students, parents, staff members and administrators, and its function is to make recommendations to the superintendent regarding operational policies and the District calendar.

DSIT's Role - DSIT has six seats on the Policy Council. These volunteers represent parents and community members in the reviews, deliberations and recommendations of the council. DSIT representatives are asked to serve for three years with staggered terms so each year, two DSIT members "retire" while two new members join.

Expectations for Volunteers - Policy Council meets during the day every other month. Most recently, meetings were on a Thursday from 1-3PM starting in September. This year's Policy Council meeting schedule will be posted soon.

Volunteers are expected to:

- Attend all Policy Council Meetings.
- Prepare for each meeting by studying the policies that will be reviewed and discussing them with other DSIT Policy Council members.
- Participate actively in Policy Council meetings representing parents and community members points of view on matters discussed.
- Attend monthly DSIT meetings to network with others regarding Policy Council agendas.
- Assist in preparation of an end-of-year Policy Council Summary report
