

Frequently Asked Questions

Broomfield Police & body-worn cameras

Q. When will School Resources Officers (SROs) use the body-worn cameras?

- As a general rule, a SRO's body-worn camera is deactivated on school property unless:
 - Responding to an imminent threat to the safety of students, staff or the school community
 - Affecting an arrest
 - Conducting a criminal investigation when all parties being visibly or audibly recorded are in a private room and have provided consent
 - Controlling a person through response to resistance

Q. Can an individual ask that the recording stop?

- Yes. However, officers are not required to stop recording an event, situation, or circumstance solely at the demand of a member of the public.

Q. What happens to the video after it is recorded?

- Officers will upload recordings in accordance with procedure and document the existence of the recording in any related case report. All video will be kept in compliance with Colorado State record retention laws.

Q. Will videos be made available to the public?

- All body-worn camera recordings, recorded images, and audio recordings are property of the Broomfield Police Department. Any public release of recordings must go through the proper process of submitting an Open Records Request to the Broomfield Police Records Unit.

Q. Who will be responsible to make sure that video is not destroyed, altered or tampered with?

- Recordings will be stored either locally or in the cloud and will be maintained by the Records Unit of the police department.
