

**Resolution Establishing a Plan for Using
and Distributing Mill Levy Override Revenue**

WHEREAS, Colorado House Bill 17-1375 and Colorado Revised Statute 22-32-108.5 allow district boards of education to implement a plan for using and distributing additional mill levy revenue for various purposes, including distribution to district charter schools ("Plan"), and

WHEREAS, The Board of Education of Adams 12 Five Star Schools has chosen to exercise its discretion to establish and implement such a Plan, and

WHEREAS, the Plan is based on current circumstances and, as required by law, is subject to periodic review to ensure that the additional mill levy revenue is equitably distributed according to law and the needs of all students; and,

WHEREAS, the revenue distributed under the Plan shall be subject to statutory limits and any purposes specifically approved by voters in approving additional mill levy revenue; and,


WHEREAS, the Plan, beginning in the 2019-20 budget year:

1. Shall distribute to each charter school and innovation school in the district an amount equal to ninety-five percent (95%) of the district's per pupil mill levy share for the applicable budget year multiplied by the number of students enrolled in a charter school or innovation school for the applicable budget year; and,
2. Shall be reviewed periodically and updated as necessary in the future to ensure that the additional mill levy revenue is equitably distributed to meet the needs of all students and annually updated as necessary; and,
3. Shall include all elements required by law if updated in the future; and,
4. If a future mill levy override (MLO) is passed in the district by voters, the use of such MLO revenue shall be controlled by any ballot language restrictions that are voter approved.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Adams 12 Five Star Schools establishes and implements the above-described Plan for using and distributing additional mill levy revenue for various purposes, including distribution to district charter schools and innovation schools; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education, as required by law, shall periodically review the Plan and update the Plan annually as may be necessary.
